The free Barefoot workshops and resources help primary teachers apply basic computational concepts in every subject their pupils study. This prepares their pupils for the way the world works today.



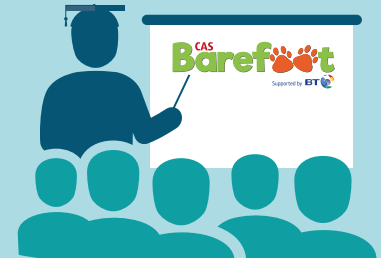
Book a workshop
